Committee Reports From 2009 Arabian Horse Association Convention

This year's Arabian Horse Association convention was held November 2009 in Reno, Nevada. I attended the following committee meetings- Sport horse, Dressage, Eventing and Driving, Jumping and Membership. I am including a summary of each.

1. The biggest discussion of the sport horse committee was in regard to splitting the in hand sport horse classes and sport horse under saddle classes into two different types - dressage and hunter types. There were two resolutions promoting these splits. The resolutions were written to say that shows MAY offer these classes but not required. As in past years, the discussion of these two resolutions was trying to define hunter and dressage type horses. It was pointed out that a survey taken a couple of years ago showed most folks were for splitting the classes. However, the committee voted to withdraw the two resolutions but recommended that dressage type and hunter type sport horse classes be added to the class lists. The idea was that shows could have the option of offering these classes and give feedback to the committee how the classes were received. Unfortunately, the AHA board of directors voted this down after convention was over. The board is supporting the education of judges and keeping Sport horse classes without splitting by type. The Arabian Horse Association has recently hired a new judges and stewards commissioner. One of his goals is to educate judges as to what an Arabian Sport horse should be. The question then becomes do we want Arabian judges be sport horse judges.

Another discussion was in regard to an emergency rule change that occurred at Sport horse Nationals in 2009. At the National show they had both judges stand at the apex of the triangle. The rule was changed so that is not a requirement.

Another proposed resolution was to allow horses earning points at an open hunter show competing in a working Hunter Under Saddle class have these points be applied to qualify for Sport horse Under saddle classes at regional and national shows. This resolution was withdrawn.

2. Dressage committee- This year there were no resolutions from the dressage committee. Several issues were discussed that will probably become resolutions in 2010.

- Winning achievement points when competing in Freestyle classes.
- Since Intro 10 and Under classes are small, it is hard to get qualification points. Make it so that they can qualify with scores.
- Request to add dressage seat Equitation to list of AHA classes.

The big news from this committee is that that our own Kaye Phaneuf is the new chairperson!!

3. Hunter Jumper Meeting- There was some confusion as to the location of this meeting so the attendance was very low. This committee also voted down the resolution to allow horses who compete in Working Hunter Under Saddle Classes in open show, to earn points to qualify for Sport horse Under Saddle Classes. It was pointed out that the number of horses in jumper classes is down so purebred and half Arab horses will compete in the same jumper classes at both Sport horse Nationals and Canadian Nationals. It was also announced that if jumps are the same height,

horses can qualify for AHA jumper classes at an open show. The owner needs to fill out the open qualification form of the AHA.

4. Eventing and Driving Committee- Most of the discussion was in regard to driving. Timed obstacle driving is going to be added to the national class list. It is already on the standard class list. Reasons were given for the need of a TD at the national show specific for driving. The show budget does not allow for this in 2010 but the committee was hopeful one could be included in 2011. There was also a discussion about making an Arabian championship within an open show like is done for endurance riders at AERC rides. One driving competitor, passed around an example of driving rules that they have used at their shows. These rules specific to driving issues, are given to driving competitors. It was suggested that other shows do the same thing.

4. Membership - There were no resolutions affecting membership this year. The main discussion was addressing the fact that AHA membership is down from 2008 - 10% adults, 13% youth. Only half of the adult members have competition cards. A subcommittee was formed to brainstorm ideas to keep members and maybe have those who have dropped their membership, rejoin.

I want to thank the AiM club for electing me an alternate delegate again this year and allowing me to attend the national convention. If you want more information on what resolutions passed, refer to the AHA website.

News from Bowman Sports Horses

Lots of news from Bowman Sport Horses. It's been a busy year.

Emily Love took on the huge task this year of learning to jump. Amazingly Emily and Ace Of Spades won their first ever outing over a course of fences in the Region 4 preshow (AiM Classic) in the Half Arab Working Hunter. To put the icing on the cake they won the Regional Championship the next day beating some very good horse/rider combos. Pretty good start.

Tayla Kyl, our South African transplant, is also having much success going from European Jumpers and 3-Day, to Hunters and Equitation, picking up a Region 5 Championship and numerous Top 5's. Not bad for a girl who once said to me, "What's a Hunter"?! Good luck in the coming year. You're going to be great. Look for Tayla also in Open Dressage.

Jade Grenland also had success this year showing her young ½ Arabian mare 5 Stars Princess Grace to her first ever SHIH High Point at the Central Point Show as High Scoring Mare. Jade also rode to an OHJA Award of Merit. She has leased a new open hunter gelding called Epic from Moriah Doyle and will show both horses in the coming year.

Jennifer Hoyt and BSH She's The One continue to do well with great wins at the Back to Basics show, (where Jen and the pony really showed up the big boys) and open Hunter/Jumper wins, including an OHJA Award of Merit.

Taylor Bowman had a very good year racking up numerous Regional Championships, Reserves, and a National Top 10 in Dressage, as well as really making a splash in the ranks of open H/J equitation. All in all, our breed show season was pretty impressive with Ace of Spades maxing out on the Achievement program and joining his barn mate Lady Loria, attaining his +++++// at the age of 18. Altogether, the barn finished up the breed show season with: 8 Regional Championships Region 4 & 5, 11 Regional Reserve Championships, and 1 National Top Ten, as well as many other wins and Championships.

Congratulations to Lady Loria alone this year, (poor Ace, we forgot to sign him up this year-whoops) on producing all of the USEF Horse Of The Year Awards including 5 Horse Of The Year Championships, and 2 Reserve Championships in: Half Arabian/Anglo Arabian Dressage 1st Level, Sport Horse, Specialty, and Hunter Jumper. Some of these were duplicate wins in multiple Regions. She is amazing, and we continue to be amazed by her. But that was not all we were up to: We're extremely proud of our performance in the world of open Hunter/Jumper and Dressage shows. It says a lot about the quality of Arabian and Half Arabian Horses and is of personal importance to us as breeders and trainers. We are also very proud of our riders and their ability to persevere in the face of huge competition.

Congratulations to the ½ Arabian Horses of BSH and their riders – all AiM members – on being part of a very small group of horses and riders to take home year end awards from the Oregon Hunter Jumper Association (OHJA) Awards Banquet this year including 1 Championship, 1 Reserve Championship, 2 Awards of Merit and several Regional system awards in the Hunters.

Equitation Medal Finals this year, but was only able to compete in one due to conflicts with our Regional show. The Nancy Wild Hunter Seat Equitation Memorial Medal Finals was held later in the season at LOH, and Taylor rode to an impressive 2nd place, after a long day of eliminations. Not bad. She also received her Rider of Honor Championship Award from AHA this year.

In Dressage Emily Love and Ace of Spades scored a huge Open Dressage accomplishment by finishing overall Reserve Champion Training Level at the Letter Perfect Dressage Show this summer. And lastly, we'd like to welcome our own Alex Bowman who just began her show career this year at the Fall Cornerstone Hunter/Jumper show. She won the Walk Trot Championship and then repeated at the Avalon show some weeks later. Congrats Alex. Keep up the good work. We can't wait to see you all this spring at the AiM at the Hood Show. We have some great new young horses and look forward to a great year.

Interview with Kay Phaneuf

I am going to try to highlight and introduce some of the AiM members. This month, I am going to start with one of our charter members and immediate past president, Kaye Phaneuf. I hope in the future to include some endurance riders who are members of our club and some members who belong to the club but no longer show or breed but support our club.

Q: Kaye, you were one of the charter members of the AiM club. Can you give us some background as to why a group of you decided to form the club?

A: When I moved to Oregon with my first horse, back in 1986, I joined the Cascade Arabian Horse Club of Oregon (CAHC). They put on a very popular show, actually two back-to-back two-day shows, the first weekend in June in Salem. This entailed lots of work by a relatively few active members. By the mid-90's, the charter members were burned out and ready to retire. The CAHC board decided that rather than hand over the club to a new generation, they preferred to disband it and endow a new club. "Should any board member opt to charter a new IAHA affiliate club within one year of this date, we will endow it with one-half of our current treasury." (And they all looked at me.) This decision to disband was made just a couple months after the first Pas de Deux Arabian Dressage Shows were held. They were the inspiration of Lisa Kolke ("Hey, kids, let's put on a show!! Two shows!"), a joint effort between her SWAA club in Region 5 and Arabian Dressage enthusiasts from several clubs in Region 4. Several members of this Pas de Deux team, plus a few working cow enthusiasts to make the requisite ten members, came up with a name, a logo and a mission statement. In November of 1996, Arabians in Motion was chartered, narrowly edging out the southern California/Nevada group to become the first sport horse club chartered by IAHA.

Q: How did you become involved with the Arabian horse?

A: In fifth grade, I became best friends with an equally horse-crazy girl. We spent endless hours reading about, drawing pictures of, and discussing horses, and agreed that Arabians had to be the absolute most wonderful breed on earth. 25 years later, the same friend and I found ourselves watching morning workouts at the racetrack in Hot Springs, Arkansas. I, still horseless, said, "Someday..." She shot back, "If not now, then when?" and educated commitment-shy me about the advantages of leasing a horse. Shortly after returning to Kansas City, Doug and I went for a walk through the woods behind our new home and found ourselves looking at pastures full of Arabians. There was a horse trailer parked next to a barn, and a phone number painted on the trailer. As soon as we got home, I called it, and within a week had leased S-Par's Brasada [Frohock Bouffon x Prefija], a bay Arabian gelding bred by a woman named Kaye. (Clearly a sign that we were meant to be.)

Q: How many horses do you now have and what is and has been your involvement with them?

A: At the moment, I have six – five at home and one away at horse boarding school. When we moved to Oregon, a series of fortuitous circumstances led me to board Braz at Mary Walhood's Ibis Arabians in Aurora. This is where I discovered dressage and Mary's Gai Parada son, Gai Midas. I fell in love with both. In short order, I acquired two Midas daughters, Mi-Gai Pacifica and RJ Gai Midas

Touch, and began a breeding program. In case anyone missed my tribute in last summer's show program, it's reprinted on pages 16-17. It recaps 20 years of breeding, and I'm pretty proud of what these two mares accomplished.

In addition to Touch and Pacifica, I still have Pacifica's first Half-Arabian son, Firgrove Trakhen Up+/, by the Trakehner stallion, Faber. Trakker and I have competed in dressage, hunter hack, hunter pleasure, sport horse in-hand and under saddle, and show hack, with some success at the local, regional and national level. I'm proud to say that every point for his Legion of Honor was earned with me riding or leading him. Pacifica's daughter, Firgrove Pacific Ekko+, by the Dutch Warmblood stallion, Kevekkko, was started by Katy Stodick and now lives and trains with Koby Robson in Sisters. Ekko has a zone championship in Hunter Breeding, regional Top Fives in Sport Horse In-Hand and championships in Dressage and Sport Horse Under Saddle, and a national Top Ten in Hunter Hack. Pacifica's grandson, Firgrove Ausabl River++++//, an Anglo-Arabian gelding out of a granddaughter of the great Thoroughbred race horse, War Admiral, is back with me after a very successful career in southern California. And finally, Fir Grove Farm's (and Touch's) last baby, Firgrove Best of Both, by Deborah Hausman's Dutch Warmblood, Caletino, is waiting for his turn in the show ring.



One of the proudest weeks of my life was the 2004 Sport Horse Nationals at Rancho Murieta, California. First, because it was the first west coast SHN: the culmination of years of work devoted to growing dressage, and then sport horse, at the regional and national level. Second, because AiM was there in force; the phoenix rising from the ashes of the CAHC had become a leader in the Arabian sport horse world. What with the reputation we'd earned with our shows, the fabulous Taste of Oregon aisle party we put on, and the

enthusiastic cheering from our section of the bleachers, folks knew AiM was there! And the icing on the cake was watching Pacifica's get and grand-get prove the merit of the Fir Grove Farm breeding program. Firgrove Trakhen Up: Reserve Champion Dressage First Level ATR and Top Tens in Sport Horse In-Hand ATH and Dressage First Level Open. Extragold Memory (Twinfir Extragold x Mi-Gai Pacifica): Top Ten Sport Horse In-Hand ATH. Firgrove Ausabl River: Champion Sport Horse In-Hand ATH and five additional Top Tens in Dressage, In-Hand, Working Hunter, and Hunter Hack.

Q: How would you like to see the club expand in terms of activities and membership?

A: I feel like a doting grandma when I reflect on how far AiM has come...in just ten short years, we have gone from being the newest, smallest club in Region 4 to the largest, and we have stayed the largest for three years now, with over one hundred members!

Unfortunately, I think AiM's growth has come at an unintended cost – as more and more sport horse enthusiasts join our club, come to our shows and, most important, compete more or less exclusively in our disciplines, other Region 4 clubs have dropped the sport horse disciplines from their shows. We brought some of this on ourselves, when we complained too loudly that their footing wasn't good enough, their judges weren't knowledgeable, they didn't "do it right." And some of it is just because dressage, hunter/jumper and sport horse in-hand are very expensive classes to hold. They require special equipment, special judges, and often extra fees. They have their own sets of complicated rules and procedures. And, of course, each individual class entry requires 3-7 minutes of the judge's undivided attention. When I first started showing, it was in 25-horse western pleasure classes. (Well, OK, "Western Pleasure, Purebred Arabian Gelding, Kansas-Owned Horse, Adult Amateur to Ride" only drew six entries out in Abilene, but a lot of other classes did much better!) It's far easier to keep class fees down and profits up when 25 horses share 15 minutes of the judge's time. We can't blame the other clubs for choosing the course they have, but we must continue to try to change their minds.

I am thrilled to see an increase in members interested in driving and jumping, two key 'legs' of the multi-legged stool that is sport horse – the others being dressage, sport horse in-hand, and sport horse under saddle/show hack. (Distance riding, in this analogy, being the side table to the stool. Together, a complementary pair, but distance riding is perfectly capable of standing on its own.) I would like to see more of our dressage riders cross over into show hack. I think it is very important that we show to these judges horses and riders who understand and can demonstrate that collection does not mean "shorten the neck, slow down and take baby steps" and that an extended walk is not achieved by kicking 'em in the sides and rocking back and forth in the saddle like a sea buoy in a strong gale.

I am pleased that AiM is able to send a full complement of delegates and alternates to every regional and national meeting, and proud to see those representatives taking on positions of responsibility outside AiM.

I like that so many people are willing to take on the big jobs within AiM. It may be a labor of love, but it's still labor, and the more
6 we share it, the more time we all will have to spend with our

horses.

I believe that the sport horse disciplines – all of them – are growing because they are perceived as fun, humane and amateur-friendly activities. Fun for the family and fun for the horses – isn't that how we hear the 'old days' described? It's hugely rewarding to see the recent changes in the conduct and scoring of the main ring halter classes, and I credit sport horse in-hand for driving those changes.


We all agree that selling horses to each other is a much-too-limited market. Those of us who compete with our Arabians in the open world, who do well and have fun in dressage, endurance, over fences, carriage driving, working cow; team penning, whatever – we're the ones who are going to sell the rest of the world on our beautiful, charming, athletic and kick-ass competitive horses.

Many of us moved away from the main ring because it wasn't fun, it wasn't humane, because pleasure classes certainly weren't a pleasure to watch. Now I see us starting to affect change for the good of the Arabian horse, not just the sport horse. Wow, that's heady stuff. And aren't you proud that we were all part of making that change happen?

There will always be people who love the Arabian sport horse, and AiM will continue to expand so long as it welcomes them. We will never please all of the people all of the time – shoot, we'll never get all of our members in the same room at one time! – but if we remember that it's not really about pleasing the people at all, it's really about sharing our love of the breed – I think we'll be fine.

Support from Bazy Tankersley Leads to New Name for Galleries

Longtime breeder and owner Bazy Tankersley's generous support of the Arabian Horse Galleries, along with her belief in its future impact to the breed, has lent itself to the museum's permanent re-naming. Common Sense Tips for Selling Horses

Advertise! The more the better. Get free ads online on www.dreamhorse.com and other search sites (google horses for sale to get more web-sites) or pay for photos. Post fliers. Use word of mouth. Know your market. For valuable horses or large numbers of horses, advertise in breed publications (Arabian Horse World, Arabian Horse Times, and Modern Arabian Horse). For less expensive horses, use the local newspaper. Price horses realistically and be prepared to negotiate.

Make a good first impression. Be honest, but don't make your horse sound worse than it is. Have good, recent photos and video if possible available to email potential buyers. Make sure the horse is clean and presentable in the pictures.

When someone comes out to see your horse, be prepared. Make sure the hooves are trimmed, the horse is groomed, and the facilities are well maintained. If the horse is being ridden, have a place available to ride (arena or trails) and appropriate tack. Be sure the horse has been handled and ridden (if trained) recently.

Leases are sometimes a great way to help place a horse. Just be sure to be clear in the contract how the lease will work, and consider insurance on valuable animals.
