#### **ABOUT THE FACILITY:**

#### **Arenas and Footing:**

There are two arenas. The indoor (warm up) is 80X200 and the outdoor is 100X200. The footing is sand and soft rubber.

#### Stabling:

There are 20 12X12 stalls available for day and overnight. 2 Bags of shavings are included with every overnight stall reservation. An exhibitor may bring their own extra shavings. There are no tack stalls. There is an area for trailer parking in front of the stall area. Management reserves the right to assign stalls according to certain criteria. First priority will be Silver Sponsors. Other consideration will be distant horses have traveled as well as other criteria. Horses spending the entire weekend at the show will have priority. In case the request for stalls is greater then what is available; there will be a list of alternative locations for stabling. Silver sponsorship is \$75 and in addition to stall fees.

#### Trailer/Exhibitor Parking:

There is an area for trailer parking in front of the stall area.

#### Camping:

Dry camping is available. Very limited RV hook up.

#### Dogs:

No dogs allowed on the grounds.

**Sport Horse In-Hand** For rules pertaining to Arabian Sport Horses, refer to USEF Rule Book, Arabian division, subchapter AR-13. In-Hand classes will be held on the triangle. Classes with the same AHA code and fewer than 4 entries may be combined. Download individual score sheets from: http://www.arabianhorses.org/competitions/managementforms.asp

② Final order of class go and list of entries in each class will be posted at the show office and in-gate 1 hour before the start of the session. ② It is the exhibitors' responsibility to promptly present themselves when the gate person calls for their class. PA announcements, if made, are only a courtesy. Order of go for the class may be altered by the gate person in consideration of handlers presenting multiple horses. ② When everyone at the gate has shown, the class will be closed. Exhibitors on the roster who have not checked in will be recorded as No Shows.

Hunter Seat Equitation For rules pertaining to Arabian Hunter classes, refer to USEF Rule Book, Arabian division, subchapter AR-10; for Hunter Seat Equitation, subchapter AR-24 (AR 214 and 215). Hunter - Open hunter classes are judged on performance, manners and soundness, in that order. Junior and amateur classes are judged on manners, performance and soundness. Protective headgear - It is compulsory for all riders in hunter and hunter seat equitation classes, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials) / SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. All juniors riding in hunter and hunter seat equitation sections, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, must wear properly fitted protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.

**Sport Horse Under Saddle & Show Hack** For rules pertaining to Arabian Sport Horses, refer to USEF Rule Book, Arabian division, subchapter AR-13.

#### **Dressage and Dressage Seat Equitation**

If you are entering an Arabian Dressage classes (other than Western – see Western Dressage Chapter WD) these classes are conducted in accordance with Dressage Chapter DR, except for exemptions listed in AR 156. If you are entering a dressage class, please familiarize yourself with both the Arabian and Dressage chapters of the USEF Rule Book, paying particular attention to AR 156 (Dressage subchapter), DR 120 (Dress) and 121 (Saddlery and Equipment).

#### DRESSAGE SCHOOLING AREAS WILL BE MONITORED FOR COMPLIANCE.

If you are entering an opportunity dressage class, the Dressage chapters of the USEF rulebook will apply. Both the breed and opportunity dressage classes can be for ODS League recognition.

#### **Membership Requirements for Arabian Classes**

Amateur Certification- Every person who has reached his/her 18th birthday as of December 1, 2015 and competes in classes for amateurs under Federation rules must possess current amateur certification issued by the Federation. This certification must be available for inspection or the competitor must have lodged with the competition secretary, at least one hour prior to such class, an application for such certification provided by the Federation. Forms may be obtained from the Federation. Certification will be issued only on receipt of the application properly signed and is revocable at any time for cause. Any person who has not reached his/her 18th birthday is an amateur and does not require amateur certification. There is no fee for amateur certification for Senior Active or Life Members

AHA MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT Each competitor (this includes at least one recorded Owner and all Trainers, Drivers, Riders, Halter Handlers, Coaches and the Person(s) signing the entry blank) in an Arabian Horse Association recognized Arabian Division, at the time of entry into the Competition, must submit a copy of a valid AHA Membership/Competition Card, join AHA or pay an AHA Single Event membership fee per competitor. This does not apply to opportunity classes.

#### **Oregon Dressage Society League Show Rules**

#### **Purpose of ODS League Shows**

League shows are ODS approved shows intended to prepare the horse and rider for USEF/USDF/licensed shows and to provide a "second tier" level of competition. These shows also provide judging experiences for USDF "L" program graduates. In addition these shows provide training for show management and volunteers.

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#### **Entering a ODS League Show**

ODS League shows are open to all. You do not need to be an ODS member to compete at an ODS League Show. Always carefully read the prize list before mailing your entry.

- A completed entry is required for every horse brought onto the show grounds. (Horses not entered in the show may not be brought onto the show grounds without prior permission of show management.)
- Each horse/rider combination is considered as one entry and issued a number. Therefore, a completed entry form is required for each rider/horse combination.
- Entries for Pas de Deux and Quadrille classes, each rider/horse combination must fill out an entry form.
- An entry is not complete without full payment, proper signatures, and proof of any required memberships and horse enrollments. Competitions have the right to refuse entries that are in any way incomplete.
- Separate signatures are required for Rider, Owner and Trainer. Even if all are the same person.
- If the rider is a minor a parent must sign the entry form.
- Use the current year ODS League Show entry form for all shows listed as ODS League Shows. Photocopy the master entry form at the back of this prize list, or download the appropriate form from the ODS website, www.oregondressage.com/entryforms.html.
- Do not sign the entry form before photocopying. Only original signatures, in ink, are valid.
- Mail entry forms to the show's secretary unless the prize list instructs you to mail the entry to a different person.
- Entries will be processed by postmark date unless otherwise stated. When all ride times have been filled remaining entries will be placed on a waiting list, even if before closing date.
- Early entries entries postmarked before the published opening date may be penalized by being considered to be postmarked up to three days after opening date, at the discretion of show management.
- Phoned, faxed, e-mailed or hand-delivered entries will not be accepted unless otherwise stated.
- Musical Freestyle: ODS League Shows do not require a prior score at any level for Musical Freestyle rides.
- Read refund policies closely as they differ from show to show.
- Unless stated otherwise, competitions will not refund entry fees in the event that classes are cancelled due to severe weather, health risk or other emergency.

#### **Oregon Dressage Society League Shows Rules**

#### **Signatures and Documentation**

**Rider:** If you are an ODS member, be sure to enclose a copy of your membership ID or a printout of relevant page of the ODS Online or Printed Roster with your entry. Scores may not be recorded for year-end awards if evidence of membership is not provided.

Minors: In the case of the rider is a minor, the parent also must sign on the entry form

**Owner:** No documentation or membership requirements is required for League shows.

**Horse:** There is no ODS horse registration. However, several breeds recognize scores from ODS League Shows for their awards. It's always a good idea to include a copy of your horse's breed registration papers with your entry.

**Trainer:** Trainer means the adult who is responsible for the horse while it is on the show grounds. All horses MUST have a trainer, this may be the rider, owner or coach. In the case of a minor, the parent or another adult must assume the responsibilities of "trainer."

**Coach:** A coach is a person who receives remuneration for "instructing, teaching, schooling or advising" the rider. If there is no coach put the letters N/A on the line for coach.

#### **Rider Divisions**

Classes at ODS League shows may be split by division — Open, Junior, Young Rider, Adult Amateur, or any combination — at the discretion of show management. Be sure to indicate rider's division on entry, or you will be put into the Open division by default. Eligibility for the various divisions is specified in the *U.S. Equestrian Rule Book*, which is available online at www.usef.org. See rule DR119.3 for Juniors and Young Riders; GR105 and 106 for Amateur.

- Divisions are: Junior/Young Rider, Adult Amateur and Open Be sure to indicate rider's division on entry, or you will be put into the Open division by default.
- Riders are Juniors (JR) until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18. They must provide their birthdate on the entry form as proof of age.
- Riders are Young Riders (YR) from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 21. They also must provide their birthdate on the entry form as proof of age.
- For the shows in this section, adults are Amateurs (Am or AA) only if the USEF has certified them as such. Please be aware that, per the adult amateur definition in the Dressage rules, riders cannot compete as an adult amateurs until they are no longer eligible to compete as Young Riders. USEF members who apply for amateur certification will find the word amateur printed on their membership cards. A photocopy of this card is required as proof of eligibility for Amateur classes.
- Riders who don't fit any of the above categories must compete in the **Open** division.

#### <u>Classes</u>

- Management reserves the right to split, combine, cancel or re-order classes. Add or substitute judges, or make any other changes required.
- Classes may be scheduled out of order. It is the competitor's responsibility to find out his or her ride times, and to immediately notify show management of any time conflicts that may have escaped the scheduler's notice.
- Classes must be run in their entirety and may only be scheduled out of sequence to allow at least 50 minutes between scheduled start times for a rider entered on more than one horse in a class. (DR126.b (4) (5)).
- Failure to enter the competition arena at the assigned time will result in elimination.
- Classes offered at third level and above do not qualify for ODS year end awards

#### Para Equestrian Dressage Classes

- Special equipment required for a Para Equestrian is the responsibility of the rider.
- Tack and equipment shall follow USEF rules see USEF DR121, with the exception of Aids / Equipment Allowed as stated on the Riders Official Dispensation Certificate.

#### Para Equestrian Dressage Classes (continued)

- Attire shall follow ODS League Show Rules with the exception of Aids / Equipment Allowed as stated on the Riders Official Dispensation Certificate .
- Para Equestrian classes offered at ODS league shows do not qualify for year end awards.
- Must have an ODS "Official Dispensation Certificate" to enter Para Equestrian classes.

#### **Western Dressage Classes**

- If a horse is cross-entered in Western and regular dressage classes, the regular dressage class must be scheduled before the western dressage class.
- Tack and equipment shall follow USEF WD 118. 1 & 2, WD 119. Western tack and equipment is permitted for warm up for Western dressage classes.
- Attire shall follow WD 121 except that protective headgear per DR120 & GR801 MUST be worn at all time while mounted.
- All western dressage classes must be judges by a USDF L program graduate or a USEF licensed dressage judge.
- USEF Western dressage tests must be used. Can be downloaded from www.usef.org
- Western dressage classes offered at ODS league shows do not qualify for year end awards.

#### **Attire**

The dress code for ODS league shows consists of informal show attire. For example:

- A short or long sleeved shirt or polo shirt, turtle neck sweater or similar (tee shirts, sleeveless shirts and tank tops are not permitted)
- Breeches, jodhpurs or casual pants (jeans are not permitted)
- Boots, Long or short boots with a heel are compulsory. Half chaps, gaiters and/or leggings are allowed.
- At any time while mounted on the competition grounds, all riders must wear protective headgear as defined by the USEF Rule DR120 and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.
- Riders may wear English traditional/formal show attire.

#### Tack

• Tack and equipment requirements both in the show ring and in the warm-up arena MUST follow current USEF rules - see USEF DR121. They apply to both competing and non-competing horses from the time horses are admitted to the show grounds and to the end of the show.

#### **Horses**

- A horse must be 36 months of age (from foaling date) to compete under saddle in the Dressage division. It must be at least 6 years old (January 1 of foaling year to January 1 of competition year) to compete above Fourth Level, and 7 years old to compete at Grand Prix.
- A horse may be entered in a class only once.
- A horse may compete in a maximum of three dressage tests per day at Fourth Level and below, or two tests above Fourth Level. Freestyles are included in these counts; equitation and materiale classes are not.
- A horse can be entered in no more than two consecutive levels at any one competition, even if being rode by two different competitors. (Exception: Pas de Deux.)
- Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is out of their stall. . (This includes being tied to a trailer if haul ins are allowed).
- Drugs and Medications: Competitors are expected to comply with the current USEF regulations.

#### **Oregon Dressage Society League Shows Rules**

#### At the Show

- Nobody may be on foot in the warm-up area.
- If a mathematical error on the scoresheet is discovered, it must be brought to the attention of competition management within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of that competition day.
- In the case of a dispute, a protest should be filed with the show management within one hour of the occurrence. Show management will appoint a three-member committee consisting of show officials to adjudicate disputes. A decision must be made within one hour of the time a complaint is filed, and, once ruled upon, the decision of the committee is final.
- Unless it is stated otherwise, entrants must provide buckets and feed .

#### **ODS League Show Awards**

#### **ODS Horse/Rider Awards**

- A small brass plate will be awarded to each ODS member in good standing who earns a score of 60% or better at ODS approved League shows in a single show season. Awards are given for the following:
  - a. Introductory, Training, First and Second Level
  - b. Dressage Rider Tests (DRT) at Training, First and Second levels
  - c. Freestyle Rides, Quadrille Rides and Pas de Deux rides up thru Second level
- Plates are engraved with the horse's name, level of competition and number of 60% or better scores in that show season.
- A personalized wall plaque is available for purchase for mounting the plates.
- Members are responsible for checking the ODS website for accuracy before plates are engraved.

#### League Show High Point Awards (LSHPA)

- Ribbons and a small brass plate, engraved with the horse's name, award level and division, will be awarded to each Champion and Reserve Champion.
- Awards are for horse/rider combinations demonstrating consistent excellence at ODS Approved League Shows.
- The qualifying period shall be that of the ODS Championship Show
- League Show High Point Awards will be awarded in the following divisions:
  - Adult Amateur (as defined by USEF GR1306)
  - Open
  - Junior/Young Rider
- League Show High Point Awards will be awarded in the following levels:
  - USDF Introductory Level
  - USEF Training Level
  - USEF First Level
  - USEF Second Level

- USDF Musical Freestyle Training-Second Level
- USDF Pas De Deux Introductory-Second Level
- USDF Quadrille Introductory-Second Level

To receive a LSHPA, a horse/rider must: have competed in the minimum number of tests for each level as shown in the following table:

#### **QUALIFYING RULES**

#### General

- Only scores earned in classes second level and under are eligible for ODS League Finals Championship Show
- Rider must be a *current ODS member* in good standing at time scores are earned.
- Riders entering the Oregon High School Championship must be a enrolled in an official ODS High School Team in good standing.
- High School riders may enter the ODS League Finals Championship divisions as well as the High School Championship.
- A horse may be entered by two riders provided both meet the qualifying requirements and are competing in the same division. The horse may not be entered at the same level, only at consecutive levels by the two riders.
  - a) Additionally, at no time during the League Finals Championship competition may an entered horse be ridden by anyone other than the rider(s) entered on that horse (with the exception of a groom walking on a loose rein).
- Attach photocopies of the front cover of the qualifying tests to the entry form and proof of your ODS membership,
   either a copy of your ODS membership card OR a copy of the relevant page of the current membership list.
- Horse/Rider combinations winning ODS League Finals Championship Classes may not compete at that level in future
  ODS League Finals Championship Classes. However, If a horse rider combination wins a League Finals Championship
  with fewer than 3 in the class then the horse/rider combination is eligible to compete in League Finals Championship
  at same level the following year, provided the qualifying criteria are met.

#### **Championship Classes**

- League Finals Championship classes <u>must be ridden from memory</u>
- Whips are not allowed

#### Scoring

- Qualifying scores must be earned by a horse/rider combination, they cannot be earned separately.
- Only scores received at ODS League shows may be used.
- Only scores received using current USDF / USEF approved dressage tests count.
- Championship scores will be calculated by averaging the percentages earned in the two tests ridden.

#### Qualifying

The qualifying year is defined as starting the day after the League Finals Championship for the previous year's show and ending on the closing date for the current year's League Finals Championship Show.

#### Minimum Qualifying Scores:

- Entries must have earned two qualifying scores; per level, per division and from two different judges at two separate competitions.
- There are no qualification requirements for the ODS League Finals Championship Freestyle, Pas de Deux or Quadrille for the Oregon High School Championship.
- The minimum percentages are as follows:
